



Construction to begin Tuesday on landfill gas collection system

CHARLOTTE, NC (MARCH 6, 2025) – Charlotte Motor Speedway Landfill is investing roughly \$1 million in its gas collection and control system this spring. Work will begin Tuesday.

The project will add 19 vertical gas collection wells across the northwest side and the southern edges of the landfill. Work will also include additional lateral piping and pumps. This infrastructure will ensure that Charlotte Motor Speedway's gas collection system can continue to operate efficiently and will allow the landfill to better control the potential for offsite odor.

These enhancements also allow us to continue to convert gas to renewable energy through a partnership with Opal Fuels. The gas-to-energy plant can power the equivalent of 10,000 homes.

Construction work will run from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m., Monday through Saturday. No infrastructure work will occur on Sunday.

While construction trucks will be visible during this time, Charlotte Motor Speedway does not anticipate any increase in noise, beyond that of normal operations.

Construction is expected to be complete by the end of June, weather permitting.
