



Improvements to Landfill's gas collection system

CHARLOTTE, N.C. (April 21, 2026) – Charlotte Motor Speedway has begun work on a new construction project designed to improve and enhance its gas collection and control system.

Crews will be re-drilling and upgrading 13 of the landfill's vertical gas wells, as well installing three new wells. Additional upgrades include new horizontal piping and air lines. The total cost of the upgrades is expected to exceed \$1 million.

These improvements help ensure that the landfill continues to operate efficiently, maximizing gas collection at the site and better control the potential for offsite odor.

In May 2025, Charlotte Motor Speedway Landfill announced a new joint venture with OPAL Fuels Inc., to establish a biogas-to-renewable natural gas/RNG facility at the landfill. These efforts allow us to continue to convert landfill gas into renewable energy, producing enough to power the equivalent of 10,000 homes.

Construction work will run from **7 a.m. to 6 p.m., Monday through Saturday**. No infrastructure work will occur on Sunday.

While construction trucks will be visible during this time, Charlotte Motor Speedway does not anticipate any increase in noise, beyond that of normal operations.

Construction is expected to be complete by early August, weather permitting.
